President's Report - Corinne Dyksen

- Teacher Lunch huge thank you to parent helpers/donors! Dishes are in the lounge for anyone who left theirs.
- Sale of science fair boards Friday afternoon at carline until 4:30pm \$3 cash only
 Science fair is open to all grades (53 entries so far!)
- DPC Last meeting was on Security; next meeting is on 3/20 from 12-2:30pm at OPM and will be focused on Technology
 - February's meeting brought up a lot of questions regarding security
 - Jason Russell is our security coordinator
 - Changes will be made at Cornell regarding playground supervision, etc. (email was already sent out)
 - This summer a secure vestibule will be installed by the office and we'll retrain everyone how to enter the school
 - We've been very proactive in our security measures we've been exceeding the standards that are required by the state
 - We mostly need to work on process changes stricter rules about doors opening, training staff, and updating camera systems
 - OPS is looking at getting a school resource officer (plain clothed police officer at the high school, but this person may visit other schools) - concern about cost -

having this officer will be partially covered for 3 years, but after that, we are 100% responsible for cost

- Security questionnaire went out to all families please fill out survey
- Dr. Coggins is working with us on taking preventative measures. Our hope is to prevent kids from wanting to harm others at all, before they even consider bringing weapons or inflicting harm.
- Tracy is our elementary rep on the district team with Dr. Coggins and Jason Russell (Risk Threat Assessment Team). They're working to develop threat assessment techniques.
- "See/hear something, say something." We teach this to children at the beginning of the year and throughout the entire school year.
 - How can we communicate our process to parents? We teach kids, but parents might not know what the process is.
- Kids are stressed, their mental health is not great (especially at high school level). More check ins might help as a preventative measure to help see which kids are struggling
 - Mysabers assessment is given as a screener to 2nd grade through 12th grade students 3 times a year (same time as NWEA testing)
- Interest in beautification where storage shed used to be
 - Nicki Berridge is willing to help take the lead on this
 - Her vision is to clean up the stepping stones and have a natural area
 - Meridian Township has Green Grant Program Applications
 - This grant may not be what we are looking for now, as the school will be torn down in upcoming years.
